Comments from the President

Notes from the April 3rd Vestry meeting:

- Vestry voted John Armstrong as our new Treasurer.
- Vestry voted Pat Siler as our new Vice President. Pat will remain Chairperson of the Board of Elders until the Elders appoint a new Chairperson.
- An Investment Seminar, presented by Thrivent, is scheduled for Saturday, May 14 at 10:30am assuming there is enough interest. The sign-up sheet is on the table in the Narthex. The topic will be Controlling & Preserving Your Assets: Basic Estate Planning and Financial Concepts to Reduce Taxes and Transfer Wealth. *(more below)*
- A Preschool report was presented and explained that due to low enrollments (four students) revenues have not been sufficient to cover expenses. The Pre-school Board will meet to formulate a plan to return the Preschool to a profitable status. This report will be discussed at the May Vestry meeting. If this cannot be achieved the Pre-school may need to be closed.
- A final check was mailed to our Adopt-A-Student, Steve Resner, in the amount of \$901.28. Two "thank you" letters from Steve were read and will be posted on the bulletin board.
- Vestry voted to send a check to LCMS Ukraine Relief in the amount of \$3,405.00 which is made up of \$2,905.00 collected through April 3rd and \$500 from our Thrivent Designated Funds. We will continue collecting funds for Ukraine until further notice. We plan to send our next check in early July.
- St. Matthews received a letter from the Dayton Dragons asking if we would be interested in scheduling a day/night at a Dragons game. Due to COVID most of our social gatherings have been cancelled for the past two years. After some discussion I agreed to obtain more specific information and present it at the May Vestry meeting.
- Pastor Reagan and Rebecca will be on vacation the weeks of May 1st and May 8th.
 Pastor Kudart will be filling in. Alicia Driver will handle the Children's message. There is no Adult Sunday School on May 1st due to a Vestry meeting. Pastor Kudart will lead the May 8th Adult Sunday School. May 22 is the last scheduled Sunday School for both children and adults as we will recess for the summer.

As you all know Pastor Reagan recently went through surgery to repair a clogged artery. We thank God the surgery went well and he is recovering. I want to send out a special THANK YOU to Pastor Younger for leading the April 6th Lenten Service, Pastor Scheidt for leading the April 10th Palm Sunday service, and Alicia Driver for presenting the Children's Message. We are truly blessed to have each of you with us.



We Remember

More than 150 years ago, Memorial Day took shape amid the backdrop of the U.S. Civil War. Before it ended, women began decorating the graves of fallen soldiers. In 1868, when May 30 was designated as Decoration Day, loved ones placed flowers on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers alike.

By 1882, Decoration Day became known as Memorial Day, and soldiers who died in other wars were honored too. Over time, it became a day to remember all loved ones who have died — in war and otherwise. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be observed on the last Monday in May. On Memorial Day, we pause to remember people who made the ultimate sacrifice for their country and for our freedom. We also pray for those who continue serving, especially those in harm's way.
